THE Arnold Ridley GHOST TRAIN Synopsis

Six passengers get stranded at a small Cornish wayside station. Despite the stationmaster's weird stories of a ghost train, they decide to stay the night in the waiting room. Soon they regret this decision as ghostly and not so ghostly apparitions materialize.







Behind the scenes with the Nods





Arnold Ridley was inspired to write 'The Ghost Train', after he was stranded overnight at the, now long closed, Mangotsfield Train station on the midland railway main line between Bristol and Birmingham. The haunting atmosphere fired his creativity and it took Ridley only a week to complete his script. It was first performed in Brighton in 1923, before transferring to London's St. Martin's Theatre. The success of the play led to versions in Dutch and German, an Opera, books and even film versions starring the likes of Will Hay and Arthur Askey.

The life of **Arnold Ridley** is almost as extraordinary as that of 'The Ghost Train'. Born in 1896 in Bath Somerset, the son of a Gymnastics instructor, his career as a student teacher was interrupted by World War 1. He volunteered and despite having been initially rejected for

having hammer toes, served with the Somerset Light Infantry. He was injured during the battle of the Somme. After his medical discharge in 1917, he began an acting career at the Birmingham Rep, and it was during this interwar period that he began writing plays. His first script was 'The Ghost Train'. He went on to write over 30 more. When World War 2 began, he re-enlisted and served as part of the British Expeditionary force. Arnold Ridley had a successful career on stage, radio and screen, including roles in The Archers, Crossroads and Coronation Street, but he is probably best remembered for his role as the platoon medic 'Private Godfrey', in Dad's Army. Ridley was appointed OBE in 1982.
